ATTENTION MEDIA: "Decline-To-State" Voter Rights

SACRAMENTO – Secretary of State Debra Bowen today asked for the broadcast media's help in reminding Californians of the rights of voters who chose not to affiliate with a particular political party, commonly known as "decline-to-state" (DTS) voters.

"Under California law, each political party decides whether to allow DTS voters to participate in their presidential primaries," said Secretary Bowen, the state's top elections officer. "In this particular election, two of the six political parties are allowing DTS voters to request their parties' ballots: the Democratic and American Independent parties."

The Secretary of State's Voter Hotline has received several dozen calls from DTS voters around the state reporting some county poll workers have not been fully aware of DTS voter rights.

"If a DTS voter does not specifically ask for one party's ballot at the polls, he or she will be given a non-partisan ballot containing the seven statewide ballot measures, but no presidential candidate names," Secretary Bowen added.
