State and County Elections Officials Point to Convenience of Voting by Mail in June 8 Election, Offer Nonpartisan Public Service Announcements

SACRAMENTO – As the June 8 Statewide Direct Primary Election nears, Secretary of State Debra Bowen and Fresno County Clerk/Registrar of Voters Victor Salazar are inviting Central Valley media to be civically engaged by getting the word out about the option of voting by mail. Formerly known as absentee voting, vote-by-mail voting is an increasingly popular choice for Californians, but many still do not know they have the option.

“When you vote by mail, you never have to miss an election because you can’t get to your polling place,” said Secretary Bowen, the state’s chief elections officer. “The ballot arrives in your mailbox, and you can vote at any time of day or night in the comfort of your home.”

Salazar added, “Voting by mail is convenient for voters. Your polling place is as near as your mailbox and it doesn’t get any easier than that.”

The deadline to register to vote for the June 8 primary is May 24. Vote-by-mail voting begins May 10. Vote-by-mail ballots must be received by county elections officials by 8:00 p.m. on June 8. (Postmarks do not count.)

Fresno County voters may obtain a vote-by-mail application online at www.co.fresno.ca.us/Vote-By-Mail or by calling the county elections office at (559) 600-VOTE. Contact information for all 58 county elections offices is at www.sos.ca.gov/elections/elections_d.htm.

Between now and June 1, valley broadcast media are invited to air a 30-second nonpartisan public service announcement, which is attached in MP3 and WAV file formats. Newspapers and stations that wish to craft their own pieces may use the Secretary of State’s script as a guide and visit www.sos.ca.gov/elections/elections_m.htm for more information about voting by mail.

The June 8 statewide election is coming soon.
