Dear Senator Leno and Mr. Cohen:

Attached is the January 2016 report on the time it is taking to process various business filings, in accordance with the Budget Act of 2015 (Chapter 10, Statutes of 2015). During the historically high volume month of January, the processing times for business filings rose above the 5 business day average to an average 6 business days for the first time since November 2013. By redirecting staff and doing additional cross-training, we anticipate being back down to the average 5 business days by mid-February. The good news is business formation filings have increased, which is a sign the economy may be improving.

Secretary of State's Report to Department of Finance and Joint Legislative Budget Committee

The Business Programs Division Backlogs Finance Letter was approved and incorporated into the Budget Act of 2015 (Chapter 10, Statutes of 2015). The Secretary of State is reporting on the 15th of each month to the Department of Finance and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee (JLBC) on the processing time for business filings.

This is the report for January 2016 and covers the period of January 1, 2016, through January 31, 2016. During the historically high volume month of January, the processing times for business filings rose above the 5 business day average to an average 6 business days for the first time since November 2013. By redirecting staff and doing additional cross-training, we anticipate being back down to the average 5 business days by mid-February. The good news is business formation filings have increased, which is a sign the economy may be improving.
