The Secretary of State, California Confidential Address Program (Safe at Home) is pleased to present the 2016 Annual Report as required by Government Code, sections 6210 and 6216.

Since inception of the program in 1999, Safe at Home has provided confidential mailforwarding services to thousands of women, men, and children who are victims of domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault who are in need of a substitute mailing address that can be used to receive mail and/or create a public record with state and local agencies.

Participants of the Safe at Home program may also receive other optional services, such as confidential voter registration, petition for a confidential name change through a California Superior Court, records suppression through the Department of Motor Vehicles, and the ability to smog vehicles without disclosing a residential address.

During calendar year 2016, the Safe at Home program focused on delivering excellent customer service to applicants and participants, streamlining administrative protocols and procedures, and strengthening community outreach relationships. In a steadfast effort to bolster the Safe at Home program some goals for the upcoming year include a campaign to modernize the administrative process and reform the program's use of technology with the intention of reaching a wider population of Californians in need.

The Secretary of State, Safe at Home program looks forward to continuing to provide its services and serving victims and their families.
