

# CALIFORNIA CENSUS CHALLENGE FINAL REPORT\*

SUMMARY:

California is the largest and hardest to count state in the nation. The nine-week competition, hosted by the California Secretary of State, aimed to increase 2020 Census self-response rates across the state. The highest and most improved Census self-response rates were tracked in all of California's 482 cities and 58 counties to create a friendly competition and to determine the champions.



## PERFORMANCE COMPARISON:

The Census Challenge was one of many outreach efforts to get Californians counted in the 2020 Census. The graph (below) shows how the nine-week, Census Challenge performed in comparison to the nine-week interval before.



June 10 - August, 12, 2020 (nine-week interval before):

 Census self-response rate increase during the nine-week interval was 4.67%

August 12 - October 16, 2020 (Census Challenge):

 Census self-response rate increase during the nine-week, Census Challenge interval was 7.08%

MORE THAN A 50% IMPROVEMENT IN THE PERCENT CHANGE OF THE CALIFORNIA SELF-RESPONSE RATE WAS ACHIEVED THROUGHOUT THE COMPETITION COMPARED TO THE NINE-WEEK INTERVAL BEFORE IT STARTED.


