### **Secretary of State Alex Padilla to Speak at Citizenship Ceremony in Yosemite**

Secretary of State Alex Padilla will deliver the keynote speech at a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) naturalization ceremony at Glacier Point in Yosemite **tomorrow, Wednesday, September 14 at 11:00am.**

55 new citizens are expected to take the Oath of Allegiance at this ceremony.

“Over 50 new citizens will take their oath at one of the most spectacular places in the world—Yosemite’s Glacier Point,” Secretary of State Padilla said. “2016 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the National Park system, making this a truly special citizenship ceremony. The hard work and the determination of these new citizens represents the very best of our nation.”

Secretary Padilla's parents emigrated from Mexico and raised their family in the working class community of Pacoima, California. His father worked as a short order cook and his mother cleaned houses. Padilla attended local public schools and went on to graduate from Massachusetts Institute of Technology with a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering. Padilla served as a Los Angeles City Council member from 1999 to 2006 and as a California State Senator from 2006 to 2014 before being sworn in as Secretary of State on January 5, 2015.
