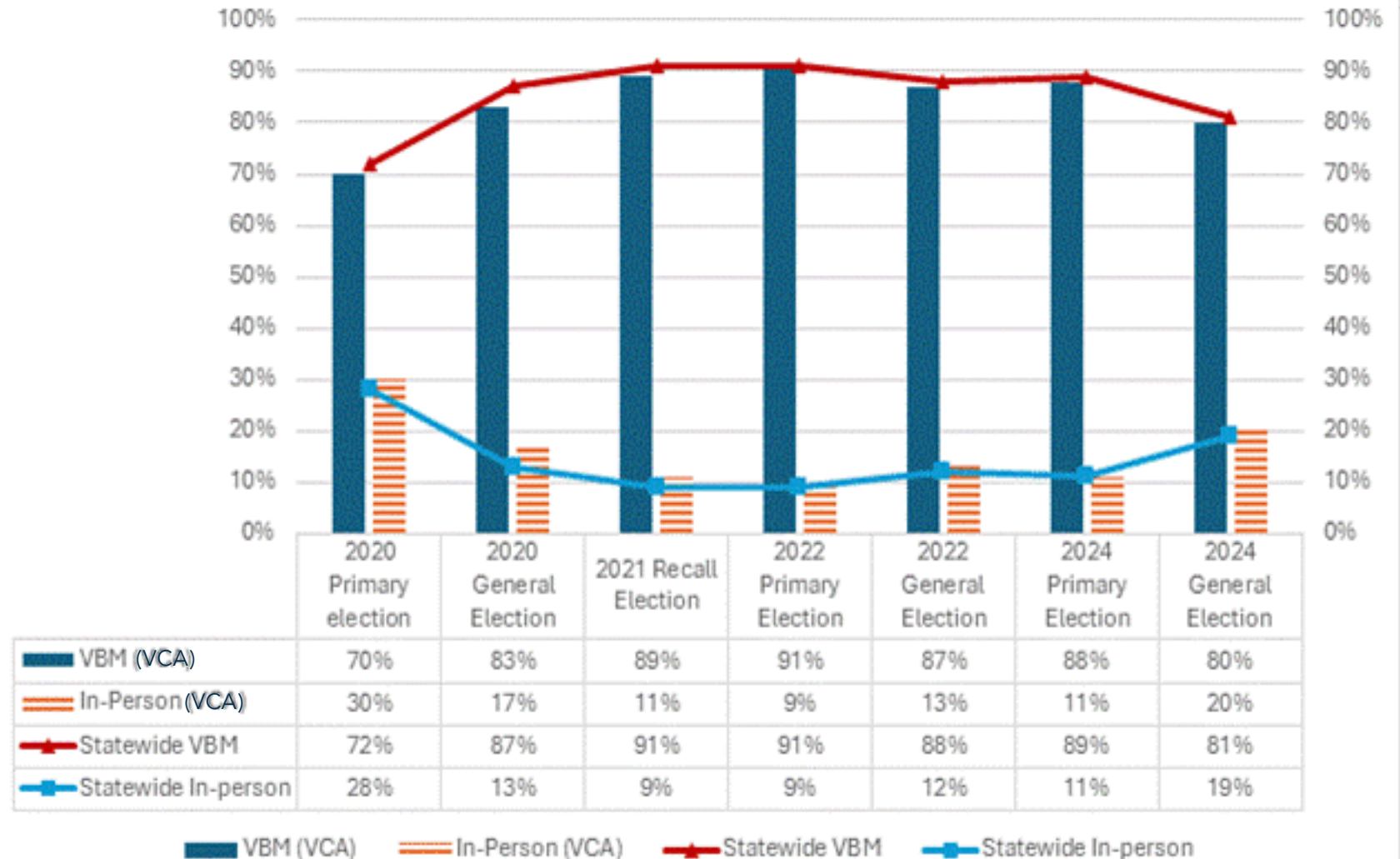

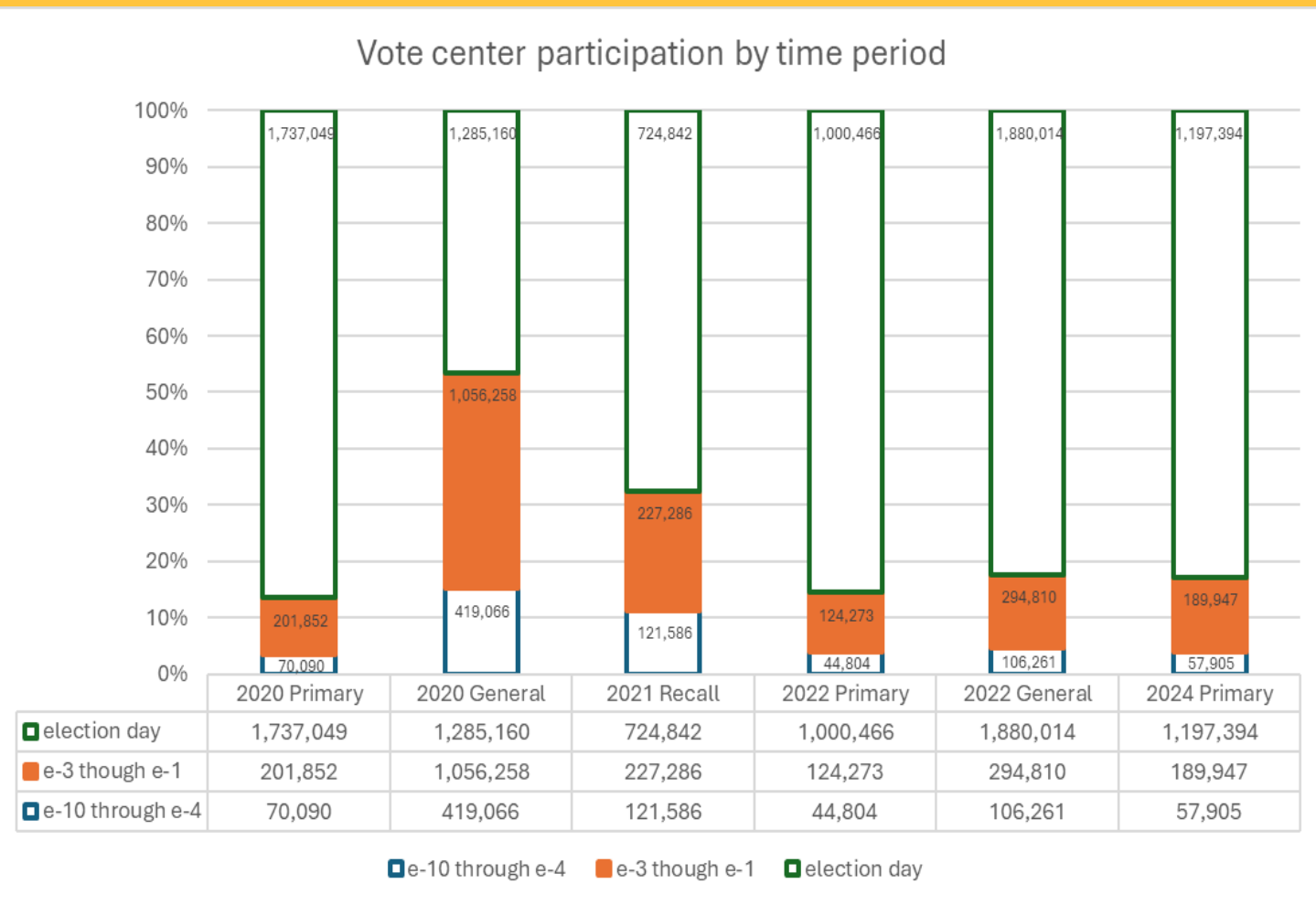

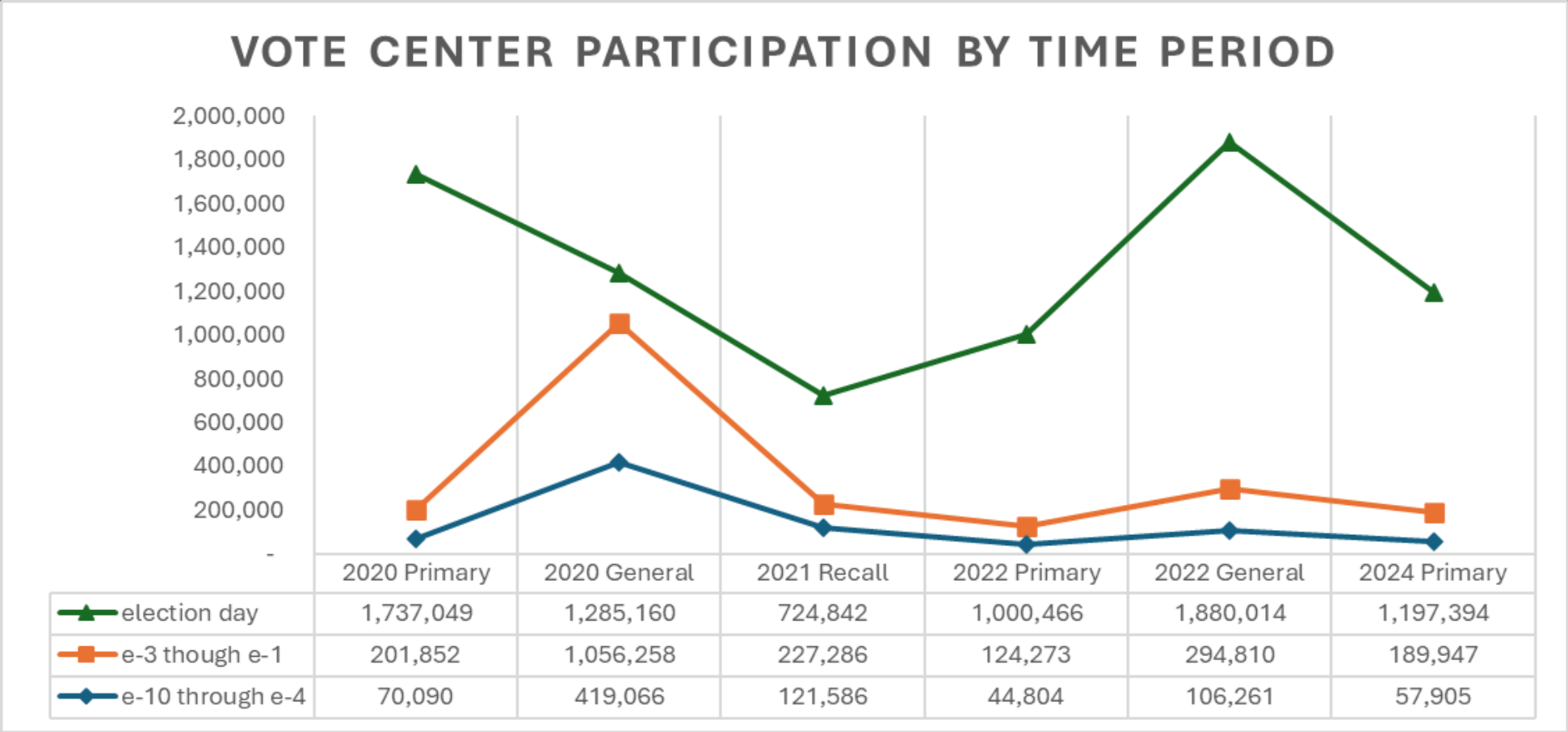

## Vote Center participation by time period



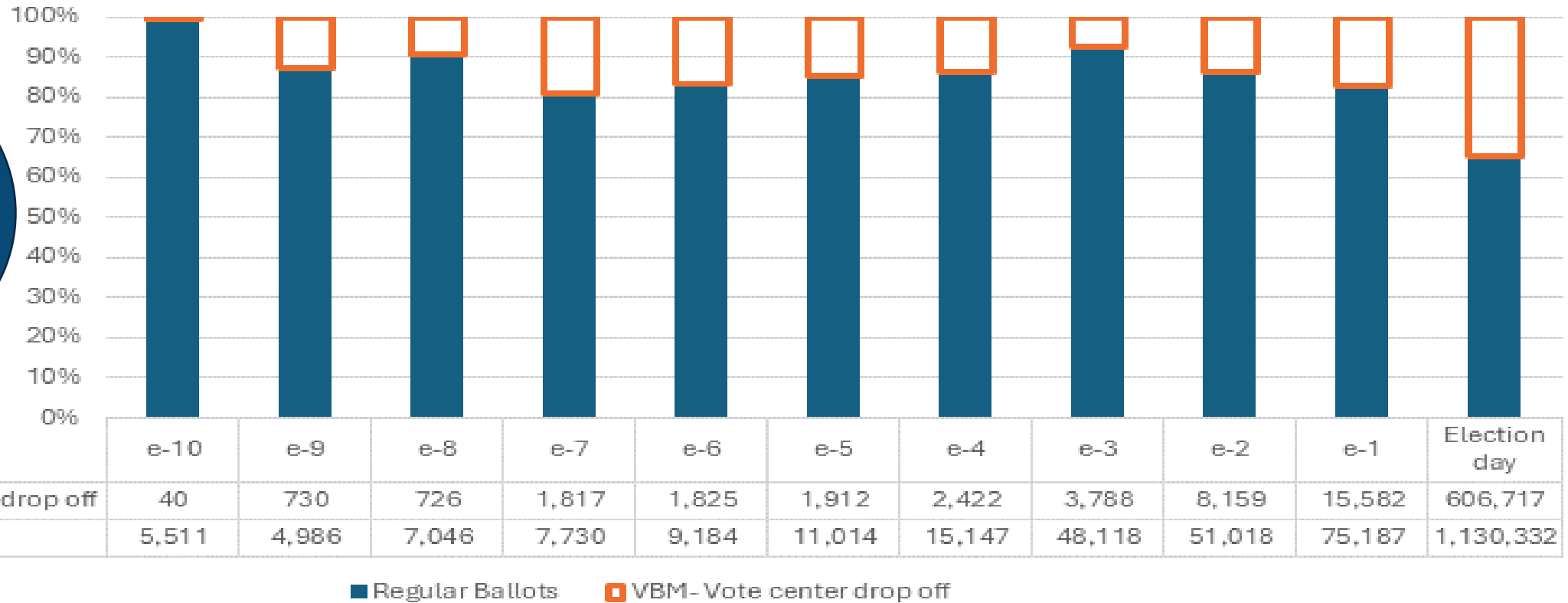

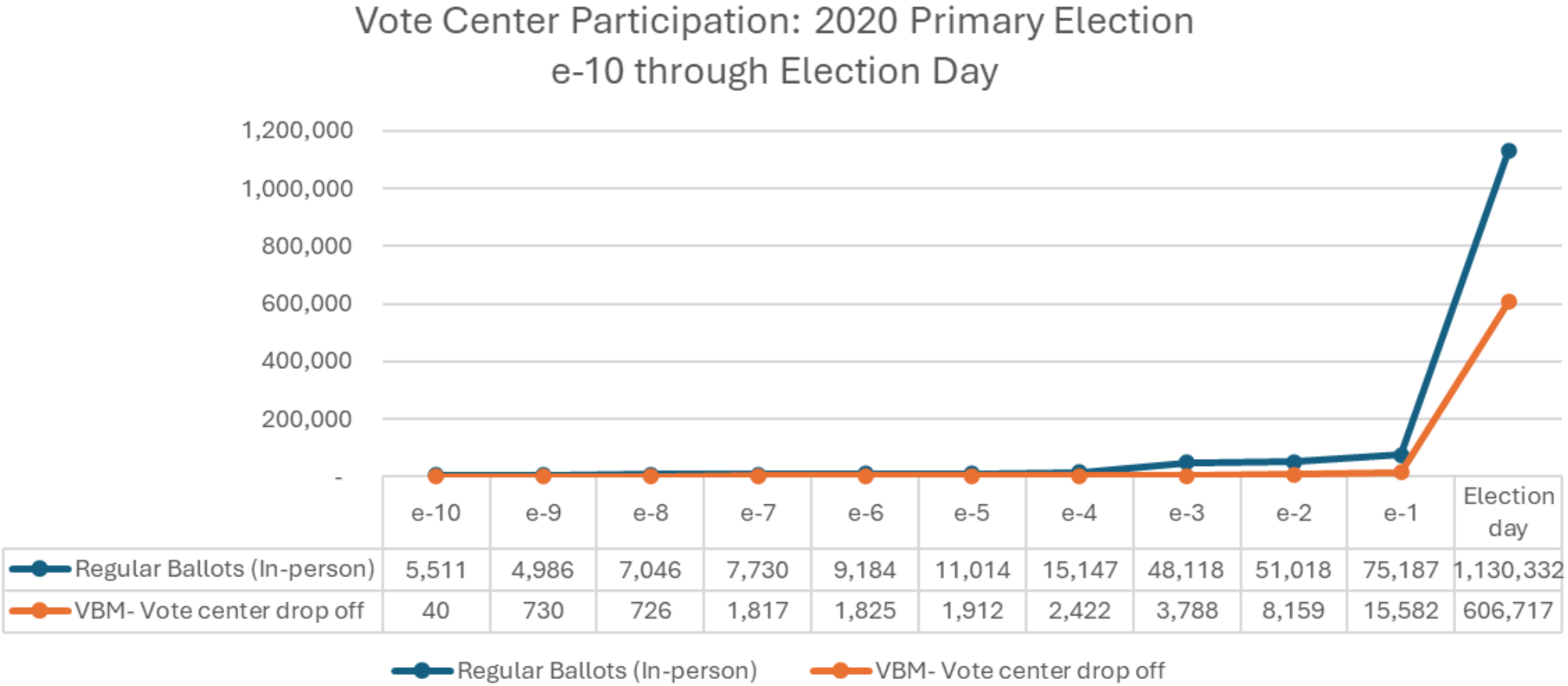

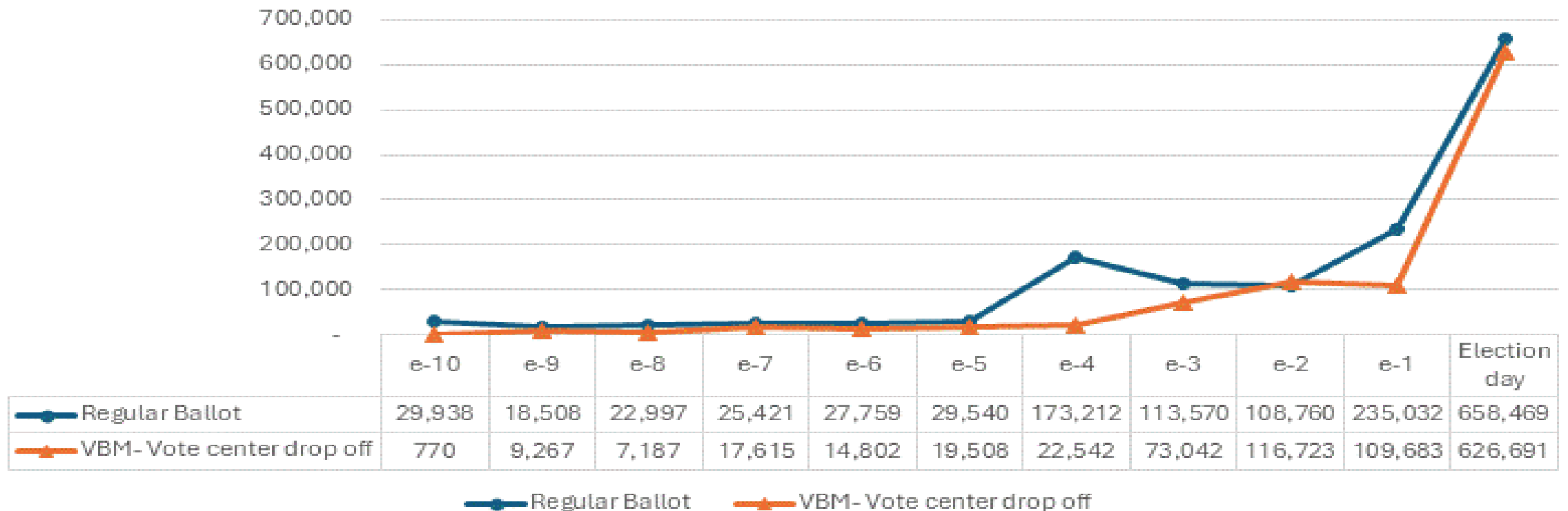

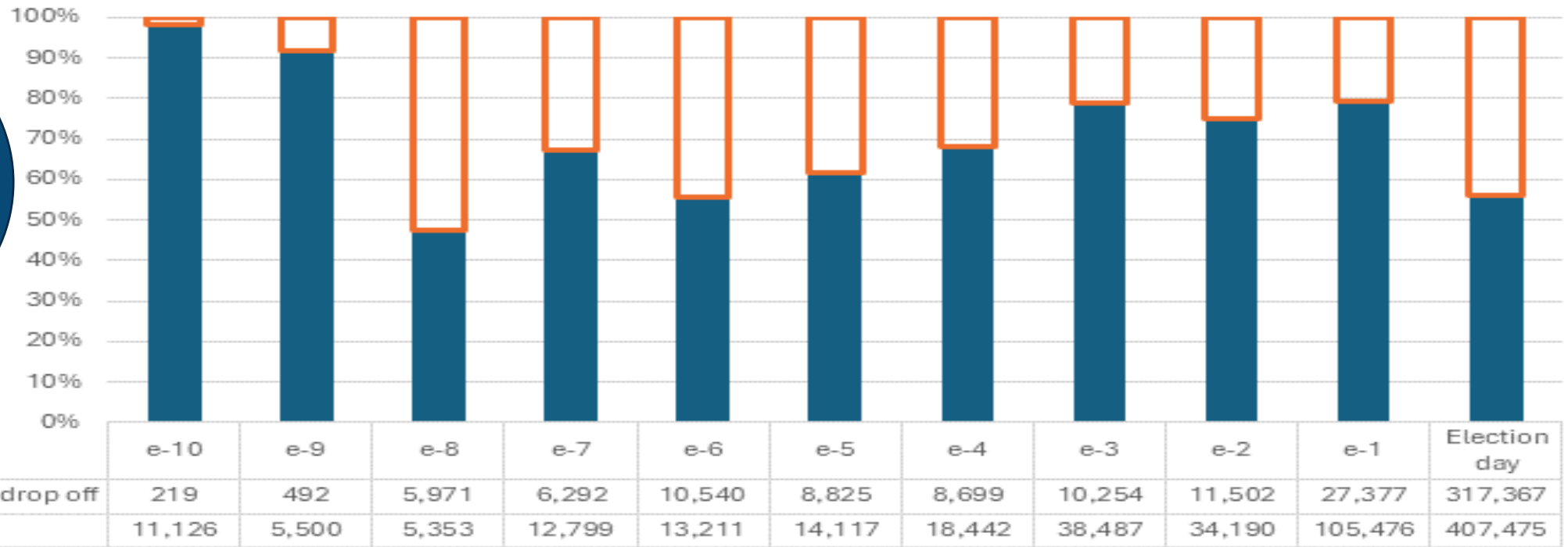

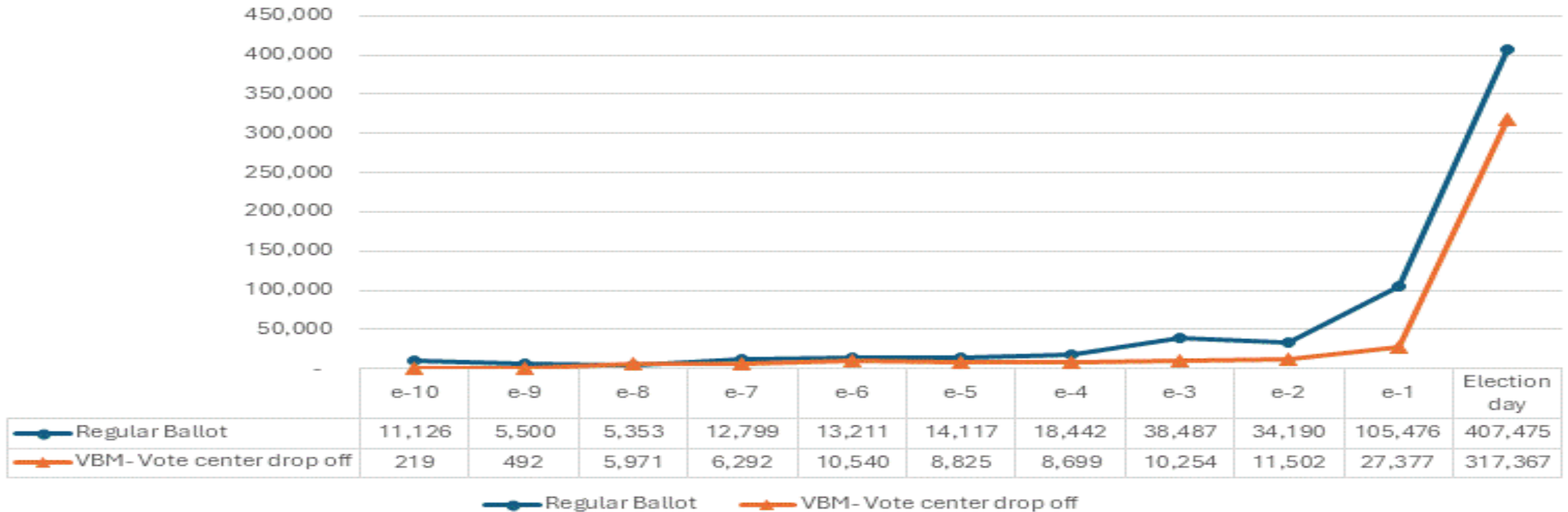

# 2020 - 2021 elections (15 VCA counties)

---

- High levels of voter activity often take place during the 4-day vote center period, especially e-1 and Election day, but there are some instances where e-4 also sees high activity.
- Regular ballot (in-person) voting is generally more popular in vote centers than VBM vote center drop off.
- Those who vote on e-10 tend to prefer voting in-person.



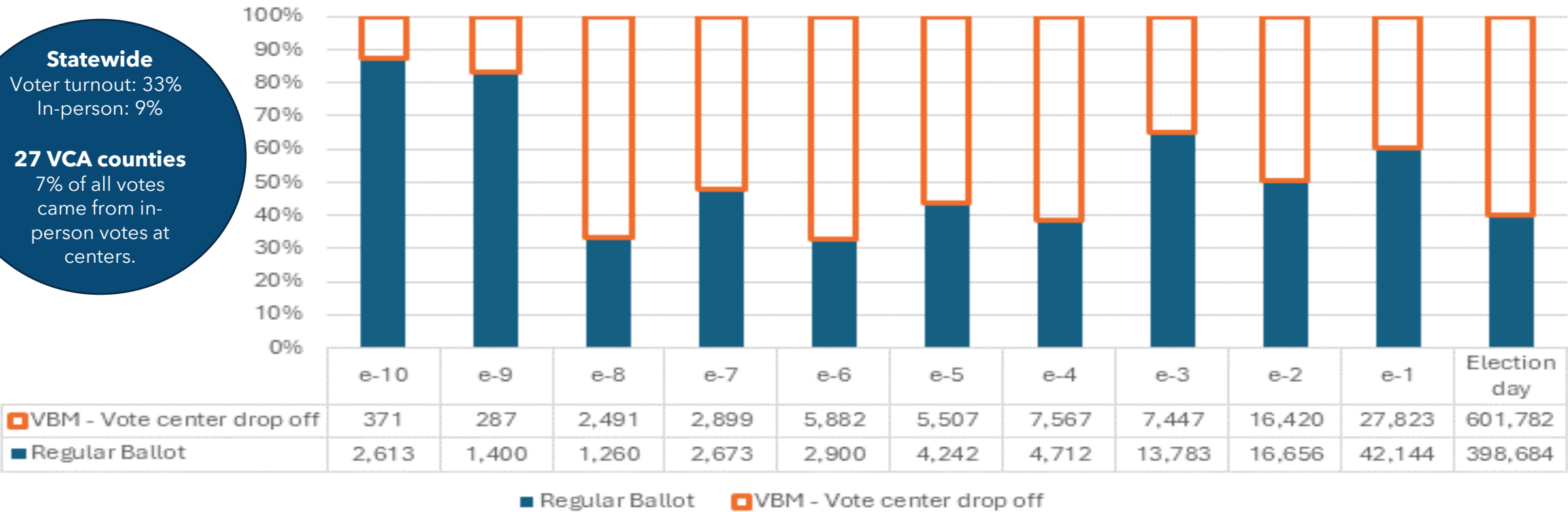

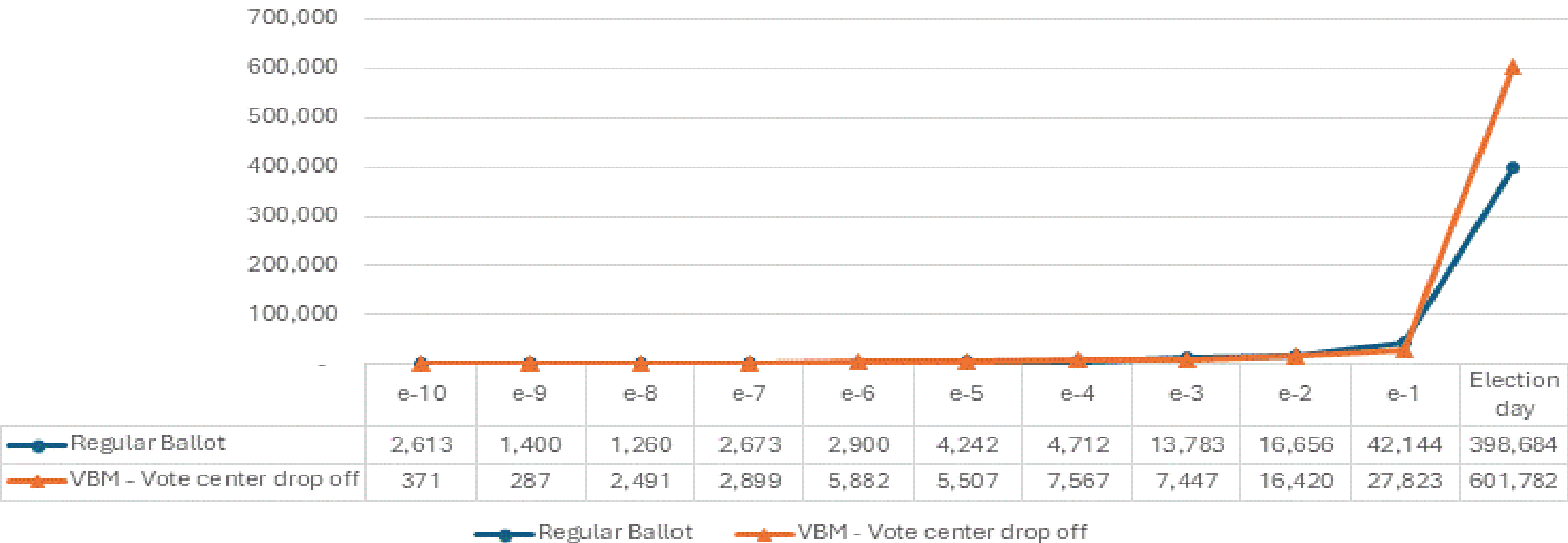

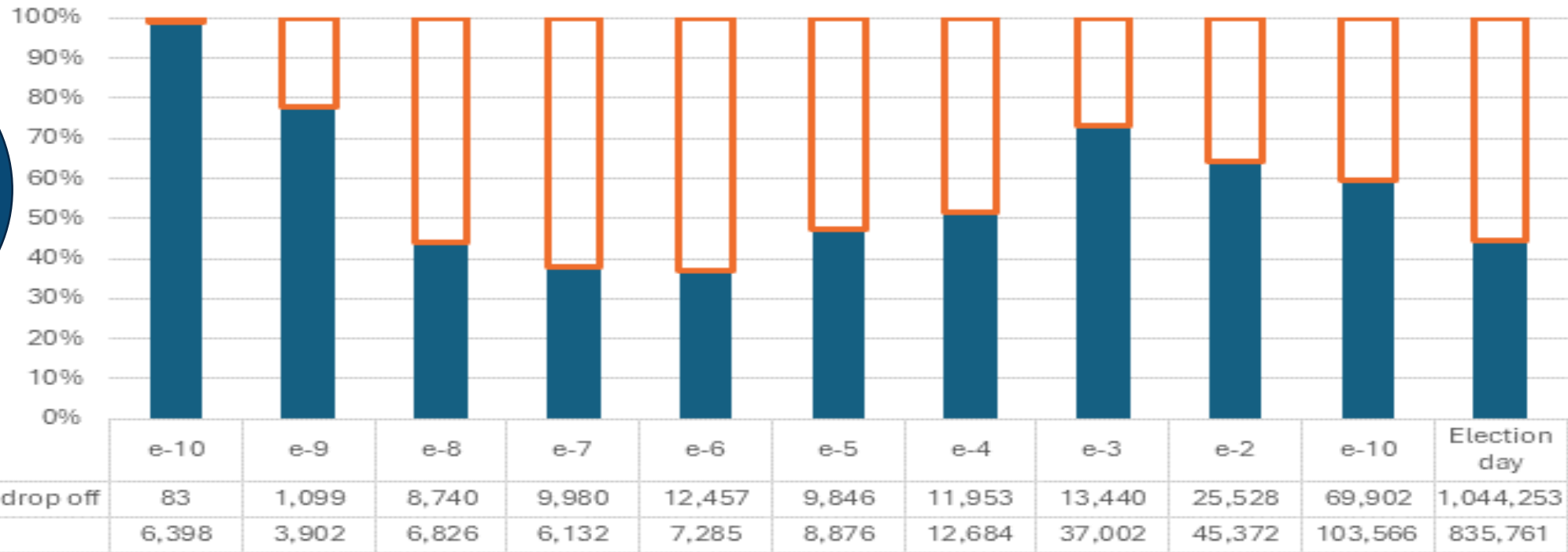

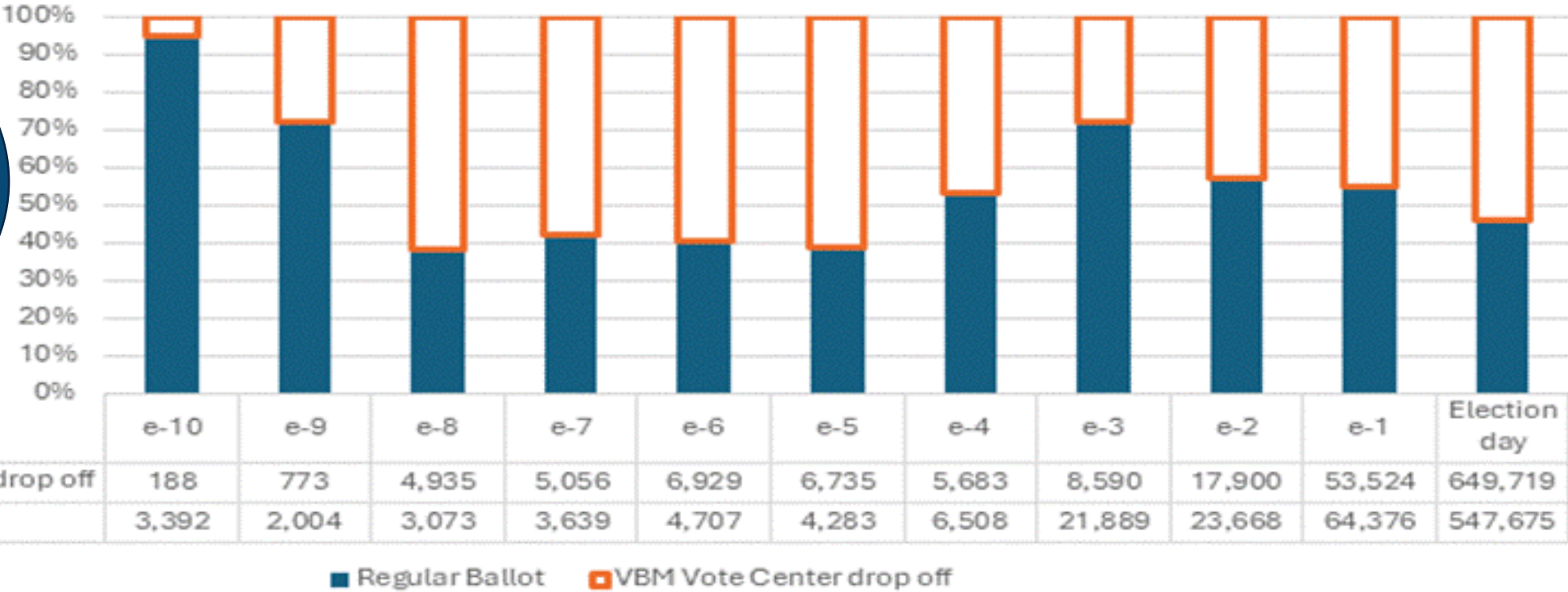

# 2022 - 2024 Elections

---

2022 elections - 27 VCA counties

2024 elections - 29 VCA counties

- Beginning with the 2022 Primary election, VBM vote center drop off on election day overtake regular ballots.
- The popularity of vote center drop off increased from e-8 and e-5.
